

Sunday, May 28 ~ Noon to 2pm Memorial Day Commemorative Ceremony "All Gave Some....Some Gave All"



The Deerfield Beach Historical Society, along with local veteran groups, will honor all military personnel who gave the ultimate sacrifice in service to our country at a Memorial Day Observance, Sunday, May 28, 2017, beginning noon at the Historic Butler House, 380 East Hillsboro Blvd, Deerfield Beach. The event, in its 4th year, is part of the monthly "Sundays at the

Butler House," a series of events scheduled for the last Sunday of each month.

Formal ceremonies will take place in the backyard of the Historic Butler House under the shade of the 100-year-old banyan tree, followed with an hour-long concert by the Hot Java Band who will entertain with several patriotic musical selections. The ceremony will begin with an Invocation, followed by Presentation of Colors, Flag Salute, and singing of the National Anthem. Coast Guard veteran and Historical Society Board Member Ed Dietrich Jr. will present a commemorative wreath in recognition of each service group represented at the ceremony. Several local officials will share their "Thoughts on Memorial Day." Additional tentatively-planned program activities will include a flag-folding drill by the JROTC, "Taps" and the traditional 21-gun salute.

Entrance to the event is free, with optional purchases for gifts and other mementos. Picnic-type food will be available for free; donations accepted. Free flags will be distributed, and free tours of Butler House will be available. Parking is available at nearby City Hall, Women's Club, and the DFB Post Office.
