A Call To Action!

DECREASE IN FUNDING PROPOSED FOR DEERFIELD BEACH DAY CARE CENTER

Please call and/or e-mail your State Senator and House of Representative listed below to prevent a decrease in funding for the Deerfield Beach - Alzheimer's Day Care Center for \$195,150, starting in July 2019.

Please thank your Senator and Representative for their support of senior services and Alzheimer's Day Care programs and request that they restore the critical funding for day care services. Please encourage them to support HB 3831.

- Funding Cut of \$195,150 from the \$434,000 budget is an over 45% decrease, which will result in a reduction of critical services for individuals with dementia, Alzheimer's disease and memory loss and their caregivers.
- In 2018 74 Alzheimer's disease individuals and 74 caregivers were provided with 33,141 hours of day care, 528 case management services, and 132 hours of caregiver training and support.
- Community-based day care programs, respite/relief services, and caregiver training and support programs are the most cost-effective way to support families caring for loved ones with Alzheimer's disease and delays premature institutionalization.
- Alzheimer's services provide the caregivers "peace of mind" and allows them to be able to continue to contribute to society by maintaining active employment.

This recommended significant funding loss of \$195,150 to Center for Active Aging will be devastating to the families who care for their loved ones with Alzheimer's disease. Your support in restoring the funding will assist the Alzheimer's Day Care Center to be able to continue to make a positive difference in the lives of families dealing with # Alzheimer's disease and memory loss.


