Through it all, Mickey was able to keep alive her biggest dream, to "be" the homemaker. Family was always first in her life and she still finds time to relax with gardening and reading.




With all this, Marge, is in regular attendance at our club meetings and functions. She has been a Hostess for several meetings and attended the District 13 Spring Tour.
