Any donation (tax deductible) to our club is greatly appreciated, together we can get this done as soon as possible. There is a lot of rain ahead in next couple of months.

Club now has internet <u>Wi Fi service</u> and *Virtual Zoom Meetings* are possible. Officers, club chairpersons, and renters are able to utilize this service.

# from the Evening Division

Dear Members,

We had a very informative and idea sharing experience at the August Evening Division Meeting.

Member Debbie Rollo who leads the Art and Cultural Department attended and spoke about having members get together at the club house and paint rocks and do Decoupage items. She showed a couple of sample rocks she has painted and an idea is to write a short message on the back and then leave them in places where others may pick them up. Decoupage or découpage is the art of decorating an object by gluing colored paper cutouts onto it in combination with special paint effects, gold leaf and other decorative elements. Commonly, an object like a small box or an item of furniture is covered by cutouts from magazines or from purpose-manufactured papers.

Marti McGeary announced the Art Competition will take place in February. It was suggested the vote be taken on a Saturday morning at the Club House so that both day and evening members can be involved. Our club winners will then be sent to the District 13 competition in March.



Member Debbie Rollo spoke at the Evening meeting this week that services are available at both Deerfield Libraries. She said they have audio books in addition to regular print books.

#### Walk-up/Drive-up Service

All Broward County Libraries, with the exception of Galt Ocean Mile Reading Center and the Nova Southeastern University Alvin Sherman Library, currently offer Walk-up/Drive-up Service. **Check branch hours as they vary by location.** 

You can pick up reserved library materials in a safe manner while Broward County Libraries remain closed to the public. You may reserve books, DVDs and other library materials using our online catalog or by calling your local library. Library staff are unable to provide customers with any materials that have not been reserved ahead of time. You must have a Broward County Library card to reserve library materials.

#### Walk-Up/Drive-Up Service

- Library staff will call customers with reserved items to let them know their items are available for checkout via our new Walk-up/Drive-up Service.
- When arriving to pick up materials, customers should call the library when they are in the parking lot.
- For Walk-up Service: Library staff will exit the library and place the customer's items on a table. Customers can then approach the table and retrieve their items.
- For Drive-up Service: Library staff will exit the library and hand the items to the customer through their car window. To ensure a safe and efficient hand-off, items will be placed in plastic bags.
- Customers must wear a facial covering to participate in this service.
- RETURNS: deposit materials at any Broward County Library book drop. Interlibrary Loan items may be placed in book drop of branch where it was picked up.

Hello Friends,

I wanted to inform everyone about some work that is about to be performed in our district by the Florida Department of Transportation. There will be road closures due to a reclaimed water pipeline project that will begin this Sunday, August 30. There will be an intersection shutdown of S.W. 10th Street at Powerline Road on the weekend of September 11. North to south traffic will be largely unimpacted. However, east to west traffic at that intersection will be detoured.

Northbound and southbound Powerline Road between S.W. 10th Street and Wiles Road in Deerfield Beach, 9:00 a.m. until 3:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, until Friday, October 16, three of the six lanes will be closed for pipe installation.
