

Amie Kay Tanner is the GFWC Woman's Club of Deerfield Beach Volunteer of the Year 2019. She has a long and profound history of dedicated service to the City of Deerfield Beach and 2019 is no exception. The Spirit of Volunteerism which is the heart of GFWC members is present from the moment you meet Amie-Kay.

Amie Kay Tanner is Florida Native-Born, spending her life as a resident of Deerfield Beach.
She graduated from Pompano Beach High School, since there was no Deerfield Beach High
School. She went on to earned a Bachelor of Science of Fine Arts in Theater and a Master in Education from FAU. She



Amie Kay has and continues as a role model for all, providing leadership skills, historical and firsthand knowledge of our city and club, and an uncanny ability to relate to the needs of others in a steady, unfaltering manner. Her quiet, reserved personality depicts strength and conviction of purpose championing the needs of her beloved city and its people. These character traits, coupled with a continued and unparalleled, commitment to GFWC Principles of Volunteerism, qualifies her as a prime candidate to receive the Honor of Volunteer of the Year, 2019.

2019 culminated in the Celebration of the 100 Year Anniversary of the GFWC Woman's Club of Deerfield Beach. Much preparation for this was needed and Amie Kay, like the true historian she is, co-chaired as our Club Historian spending countless hours and making personal donations to bring this event to fruition. The committee met weekly to organize and preserve the historical records and scrapbook from 1919 to present.

Amie Kay met with Sally Ling, Writer and Historian, to provide background for an article about our Club's legacy published in the March 2019 issue of the *Deerfield Beach Magazine*.

This year Amie Kay took on the responsibility of having the original architectural drawing of the club house restored and preserved. She takes great pride in our clubhouse since her father was the contractor who helped build and complete it for dedication in 1957. Amie Kay met with Erin Purdy, Historian of the Broward County Library, to find and include other historical materials of interest to our Club. She helped plan and carry out the formal club Centennial Luncheon held at the Royal Fiesta Event Venue. She worked with other committee members to make and frame historical photos of Deerfield Beach displayed on the tables. She helped in completing the Club Scrapbook.

Amie Kay continues to promote membership in our club. She never misses an opportunity to hand out a flyer or tell about the contributions the club has made and continues to make. Her sincerity and warm personality are evident from the first time anyone meets her. You will find her at almost all our club meetings, activities and engaged in the club projects.

Amie Kay is "Person with a Purpose" immersing herself in other historical and educational activities. She serves on the Executive Board of the DFB Historical Society and spearheads "History at High Noon" monthly programs held at City Hall. She conducts monthly tours for school children and other visitors of the Butler House (home to one of our club's founding members and now on the Florida Historical Registry). You will see her at all the many community events this organization promotes.

Amie Kay hardly misses an opportunity to become involved in Community and City Sponsored events and to wear her yellow shirt with the Club Logo. She volunteered at The Annual Beach Clean Up, The Longest Human Underwater Chain (Guinness Book of World Records, Pioneer Days City Events, Breakfast with Santa, The Art Festival and is a fierce advocate for the Music/Art Middle School Program.

Amie Kay attended the Women's History Hall of Fame Luncheon, and the Center for Active Aging Cuisine of the Region and Fashion Show. She is an appointed member of the Public Arts Committee of Deerfield Beach, and an active member of the Friends of Deerfield Island Park, and Kiwanis of Deerfield Beach, Inc.

Leadership and Public Issues in 2019 makes Amie Kay a regular in attendance at our Commission Meetings and other city sponsored improvement meetings. She speaks out on quality of life issues in our community and various projects regarding development, recycling, parks, open space, and preservation of wildlife and habitats.

2019 is a year to be proud of the accomplishments and charitable involvement of our club and to realize how much Amie Kay Tanner has contributed through her passion, love and devotion to GFWC, our club, and community. The GFWC Woman's Club of Deerfield Beach pays tribute to her an recognizes how lucky it is to have her as a member.
